## Indjalandji-Dhidhanu People Thorntonia Pastoral ILUA

The agreement area includes all of the land and waters within Lot 1 on UN7 (Thorntonia) located within the proposed Native Title Determination QUD243/09 Indjalandji-Dhidhanu (QC09/3) being an area described below:

That part of Lot 1 on UN7 west of a line commencing at a point on the southern bank of the O'Shannassy River, at Longitude 138.465960° East; then generally north easterly and generally south easterly along southern banks of O'Shannassy River, the southern banks of Seymour River and the southern banks of Coppermine Creek; being boundaries of native title determination QUD6022/99 Waanyi Peoples (QC99/23), to its intersection with native title determination QUD579/05 Kalkadoon People 4 (QC05/12) at Longitude 139.087265°East; then generally southerly along the western boundary of that native title determination.
