
# SCHEDULE 5: MAP OF AGREEMENT AREA



## **WORD DESCRIPTION OF AGREEMENT AREA**

## **External boundary description**

The agreement area covers all the land and waters within the external boundary described as:

That part of Towera Pastoral Lease (N049957) that falls within Native Title Determination Application WAD131/2004 Budina People (WC2004/005), further described as:

That part of Towera Pastoral Lease (N049957) west of a line joining Longitude 115.544568° East, Latitude 22.957428° South and Longitude 115.500866° East, Latitude 23.497482° South, and east of a line commencing at Longitude 114.990658° East, Latitude 23.560134° South, then proceeding generally northerly through the following coordinate points:
