



## Schedule 1 – ILUA Area

### External boundary description

The agreement area covers all the land and waters within the following parcels being areas that fall within native title determination, QUD380/2008 Barada Barna People (QCD2016/007) where native title has been determined to exist:

- Lot 799 on PH391;
- Lot 3161 on PH378;
- Lot 12 on CP890868; and
- That part of Lot 4 on KL210 excluding that part west of the Marlborough Sarina Road and that part north of a line defined as commencing at the intersection of an unnamed road and the Marlborough Sarina Road (just north of Lotus Creek) and proceeding along that unnamed road generally north easterly, north westerly, easterly (crossing Yellow Creek) and south easterly (crossing Cattle Creek) to an unnamed road at approximate Longitude 149.131457° East; then northerly along that unnamed road to the southern boundary of Lot 6 KL189.
