

Schedule 1 – Agreement Area

The Agreement Area is all of the land and waters within that part of Lot 21 on NPW1150 (Great Sandy National Park) covering the land and waters of Fraser Island above the High Water Mark, excluding:

- Former Lots 1-6 on Plan CP893833 (as at 15/12/1999); and
- The Bowarrady Radio Transmitter, being an area within the following coordinate points:

Reference datum

Geographical coordinates are in decimal degrees referenced to the Geocentric Datum of Australia (GDA94).

- Information on the Bowarrady Radio Transmitter site was sourced from Telstra Operations (September 2014) and is subject to survey.
