The agreement area covers all the land and waters subject to -

That portion of Blina Pastoral Lease (N049587) that falls within Native Title Determination WAD6133/1998 Bunuba (WCD2012/006) and Native Title Determination WAD94/2012 Bunuba People #2 Part A (WCD2015/009), further described as:

That part of Blina Pastoral Lease (N049587) east of a line joining Longitude 124.477192° East, Latitude 17.487555° South and the north eastern corner of Native Title Determination WAD6099/1998 Nyikina Mangala (WCD2014/003) at Longitude 124.334618 East, Latitude 17.665262 South, then southerly, easterly and again southerly, along the boundaries of that native title determination to a south boundary of Blina Pastoral Lease at Longitude 124.418040° East, and north of a line joining a north east corner of Native Title Determination WAD6099/1998 Nyikina Mangala (WCD2014/003) at approximately Longitude 124.715695° East, Latitude 17.969795° South and the intersection with a south western side of Great Northern Highway at Longitude 124.776017° East, and extending generally south easterly and generally easterly along that highway.
