SCHEDULE 4 - LOW NATIVE TITLE IMPACT ACTIVITIES

This Schedule contains classes of Activities which have a *Low Native Title Impact* (refer to Clause 22.1).

Short Description	Class of Activities
Maintenance	Anything which involves the maintenance, repair, protection or making safe of existing infrastructure, roads, structures, improvements, earthworks and areas under the <i>Local Government's</i> ownership, care or control but limited to the existing footprint of the same.
	<i>Examples</i> - Repairs to buildings, re-sealing roads and car parks, mowing parks, removing rubbish, restoring erosion.
Statutory Approvals	Anything which involves, or which permits or requires, the granting, issuing, making by or to the <i>Local Government</i> as a local government of any approval, consent or permission under any <i>Law</i> .
	Examples - environmental approvals, permits under Local Laws.
Gazettal of off alignment roads	The dedication and gazettal of a road reserve over a constructed road.
Pest Control	Anything which permits, requires or consists of the management, control or elimination of pests.
	Examples - Removing weeds, eradicating feral animals.
Contractual Interests	Anything which permits, requires or consists of the granting or making by or to the <i>Local Government</i> of a contractual interest relating to the management or use of land or waters for a public purpose.
	<i>Examples</i> - The <i>Local Government</i> entering into a contract with a <i>Third Party</i> for the mowing or maintenance of public places.
Operational Activities	Anything which permits, requires or consists of the carrying out of the operational functions of the <i>Local Government</i> and which is not an <i>Activity</i> which has a <i>High Native Title Impact</i> .
	<i>Examples</i> - Civic functions on land or waters, carrying out enforcement actions regarding alleged breaches of <i>Local Laws</i> , <i>Local Planning Instrument</i> and legislation.
Access and Site Investigation	Access and site investigation activities which do not require excavations or earthworks.
	<i>Examples</i> - Inspecting an area, surveying an area, conducting geotechnical testing, water quality testing.
Emergencies	Anything which is undertaken for the purpose of preventing or minimising physical harm or the threat of physical harm to persons or public property.
	Examples - Constructing a fire break or a safety barrier.
Caring for Country	Activities for or associated with taking care of land and waters under the <i>Local Government's</i> Caring for Country program.
	<i>Examples</i> – Pest management.
