

Western Yalanji and Tablelands Regional Council ILUA (QI2014/003)

External boundary description

The agreement area covers all the land and waters within:

- That Part of Lot 66 on Plan SP161906 south of the northern boundary of the Mareeba Shire Council.
- That Part of Lot 14 on Plan SP250040 south of a line being the northern boundary of the Mareeba Shire Council, commencing at Longitude 144.278700° East and extending east along that Shire boundary to Longitude 144.387728° East.

The agreement area falls wholly within Native Title Determination QUD6008/1999 Western Yalanji People #4 (QCD2013/002), and QUD6003/2001 Western Yalanji People #5 & #7 (QCD2013/003).

Reference datum
